Household hazardous waste is accepted year-round at the following refuse and recycling transfer stations. (Different rules and charges apply so please contact them directly to obtain the relevant information.)

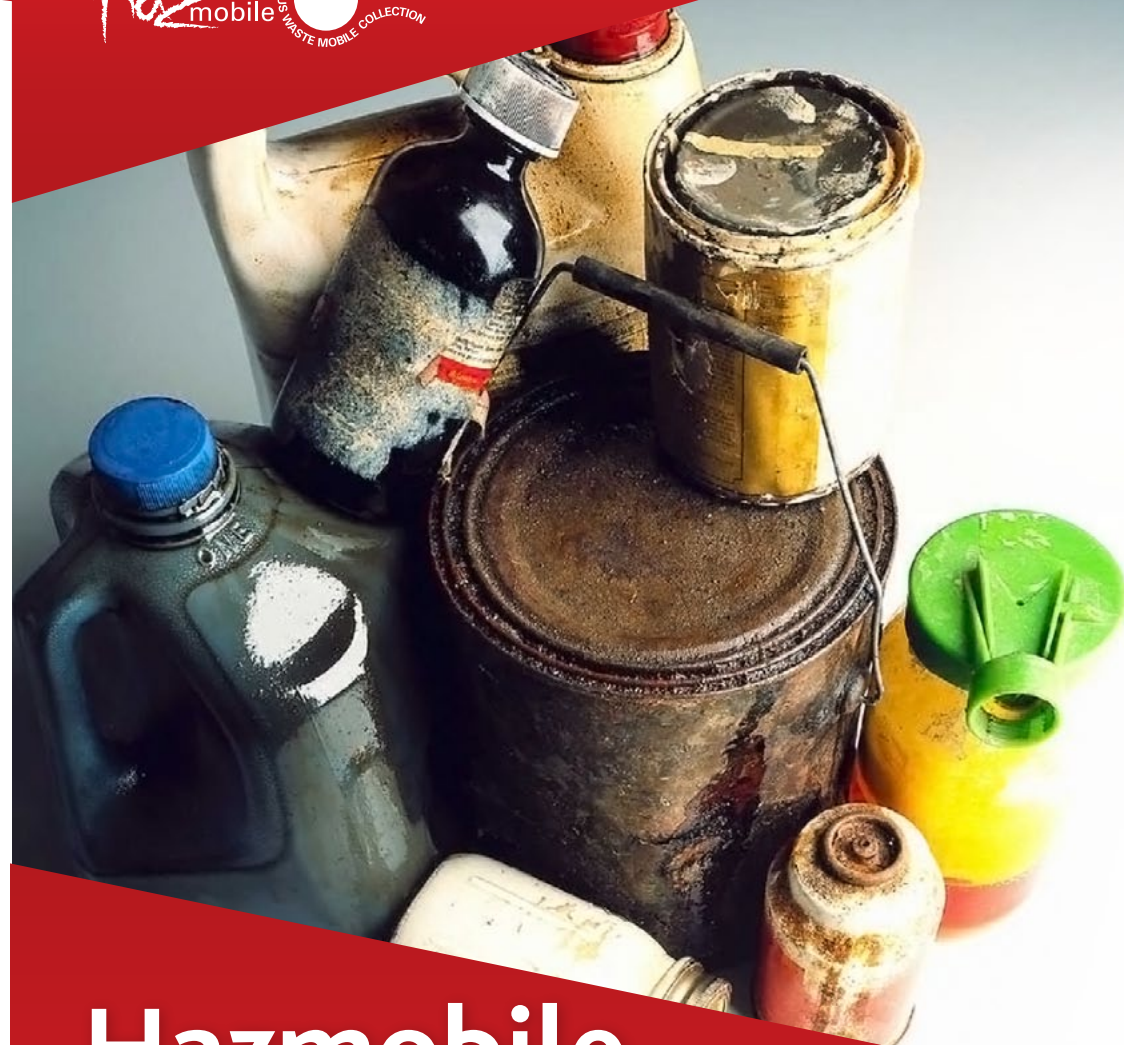
In addition, households' used engine oil can be disposed of free of charge at any time via special oil recovery collection bins available throughout the region.

It's easy!

Before you leave HOME:



Make sure nothing is leaking and containers are upright. Wrap them in plastic if you need to. **Avoid mixing chemicals together.**



Box up your waste so we can quickly and easily lift it out of your boot or trailer. **Use a box you don't want to keep** and ensure there's nothing else in your boot or trailer - in case we take it by mistake!

When you get to the HAZMOBILE:



Tell us if you have something really hazardous, old or leaking so we can be extra careful.



Drive in. Stay in your vehicle. Let our team take your household hazardous waste away.

Note: We are usually busiest between 10am and 11.30am.

What is household hazardous waste?

Household hazardous waste is unwanted household product that:

- is flammable
- is an oxidiser
- reacts with other materials
- can pollute the environment.



Hazardous waste often has labels such as 'warning', 'caution', 'danger', 'poison' or 'do not dispose of with household rubbish.'

What does the Hazmobile accept?
